Awards Night Host

Jeremy Vine

Listeners to the Jeremy Vine Show on BBC Radio 2 know of his connection to Soldiering On — the awards stories have come up quite a bit on his radio show! Happily, his Radio 2 slot has overtaken BBC Radio 4's flagship Today as the UK's most listened-to radio news programme; not that Jeremy likes to mention that much.

He also presents a daily news and chat show on Channel 5, describing his 4¼ hours of broadcasting every day (more than 21 hours a week) as "wonderful fun, if a little crazy."

Jeremy was named Speech Broadcaster of the Year at the Sony Awards in 2005 and 2011 and won Interview of the Year for the famous "head-in-hands" moment with Prime Minister Gordon Brown shortly before Mr Brown lost the 2010 election.

Vine has also presented BBC1's Points of View, Panorama, Eggheads and Crimewatch. He is proudest of having done the BBC Election graphics for nearly 20 years.

Jeremy studied English Literature at Durham University, and in 1986 began his career as a trainee reporter at the Coventry Evening Telegraph, in the days of manual typewriters and hot metal presses. After that he was a BBC news trainee, Today programme reporter (the Yugoslav war and sheep racing in Dorset), political correspondent during the nineties, Africa correspondent based in Johannesburg, and Newsnight presenter — the most frightening assignment of all, working alongside the legendary Paxman.



His autobiography It's All News to Me tells the vivid story of his first 25 years at the BBC. A review in the Daily Telegraph said: "Jeremy Vine is the perfect diarist, because he is an exhibitionist who doesn't mind looking stupid." This characteristic was much in evidence in 2015 when Jeremy was on Strictly Come Dancing. His cha-cha-cha scored a 2.

He is married to Rachel and they live with their two daughters in west London. Next year his first novel will be published, about a murder in a radio station (don't laugh).

Ensemble of the Band of the Royal Air Force Regiment

The Band of the Royal Air Force Regiment was formed in 1942. Now based at RAF Northolt, the Band regularly supports State Ceremonial occasions and international military tattoos, performs concerts to raise money for Service charities and provides entertainment at air shows and functions.

Memorable moments include travelling to Sydney, Australia to support the Royal Edinburgh Military Tattoo in 2019, performing for the Royal British Legion's Festival of Remembrance at the Royal Albert Hall, taking part in the 75th Anniversary of Victory over Japan and performing in Westminster Abbey for the 80th Anniversary of the Battle of Britain.

2022 saw the Band perform as part of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. In September 2022 the Band lined the route for the State Funeral of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II, and then once again provided a route lining contingent for the Coronation of Their Majesties



King Charles III and Queen Camilla in May 2023.

The Band has recently performed at the Norwegian Military Tattoo, the 2024 FA Cup Final at Wembley Stadium, and took part in D-Day 80 Commemoration Services held at the British Normandy Memorial in Ver-Sur-Mer.

Alongside musical duties, Musicians support operations around the world and were deployed across the UK as part of the Government's response to the Coronavirus crisis.



Harry Gordon, Combined Cadet Force Piper

Cadet Gordon returns to the 2024 Soldiering On Awards for the third time after his tremendous debut in 2022.

Harry, age 16, is an active member of ACF Pipes and Drums, and holds the Pipe Major position at Gordon's School for the 2nd year running, performing around the UK. This summer, he piped with the 2nd Battalion Ranger Regiment in the Houses of Parliament, he participated at the Lord Mayor's Parade in London, held a memorial service at the Menin Gate in Ypres and took part in the 2024 World Pipe Band Championships with the Gordon's School Pipes & Drums Band.

Christina Johnston

Christina, known as "The Nightingale," captivates audiences worldwide. At 17, she earned a scholarship to London's Guildhall School of Music and Drama, and made her operatic debut in 2012 at Prague's State Opera as Queen of the Night in Die Zauberflöte and Adele in Die Fledermaus.

Since then, she has performed at major European and Russian opera houses, portraying roles such as Olympia in Les Contes d'Hoffmann, Zerlina in Don Giovanni, and Katerina Cavellieri in Amadeus with The Prague Shakespeare Company.

Christina has sung for dignitaries including the President of the Czech Republic and the President of China, and was selected to perform at China's World War II commemoration and Israel's Day of Jerusalem broadcast.

Her voice has featured in film scores, including Interlude in Prague (2019), Battleship Island, and Wonder Woman 1984 (2021), where she sang the first operatic aria in a DC film. She has performed at film festivals alongside composers like Joe Hisaishi, James Horner, and Michael Giacchino.

Christina's debut CD, Blessing, was recorded with The City of Prague Philharmonic Orchestra, and she joined José Carreras on his Farewell Tour in 2019. Her charity single "A Million Tears" for the Purple Poppy Appeal, supported by Queen Elizabeth II, reached No. 1 on the Classical charts.

She has recently toured France, performed with Russell Watson and the Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, debuted as a Guest Entertainer on Princess Cruises, and had the honour of singing in St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. This November, she will make her Canadian debut.



Stringfever

Stringfever is an entertaining group of talented musicians that have lived and breathed music since a young age. Formed in 2003, and currently composed of three siblings and their cousin, this internationally acclaimed quartet has performed 1000+ Shows in 33 countries since 2004, from private performances for the British Royal family to a packed audience at Madison Square Gardens.

Coming from a family of musicians it was always likely that the Broadbents were going to follow their fathers into the music profession. Ralph and Sophie studied at the Royal Academy of Music and Graham at the Royal College. Once graduating, Ralph played in the premier German production of Sunset Boulevard and subsequently Phantom of the Opera UK Tour in the late 90s, alongside older brother Giles the original lead violinist of Stringfever who were joined by cousin Graham also in the revival of My Fair Lady in 2001. Younger brother Neal was due to study cello at the Guildhall School of Music... but instead he was kidnapped by his brothers to be the cellist in their new group - Stringfever!

Youngest sibling Sophie joined the band full time in November 2023, after performing as a freelance musician for 12 years alongside contemporary artists including Mumford & Sons and Ellie Goulding.

In addition to their musical heritage, the Broadbent cousins feel a strong connection to the military; their grandfather, Sergeant Smith, was a Spitfire pilot during World War II and famously escaped from a POW camp in Poland, an incredible legacy of courage and resilience that has deeply inspired their family.



The Magic Marine



Steel served as a Royal Marines Commando for ten years, spending his final two years as a Medic with the Special Boat Service (SBS), the UK's elite amphibious fighting force. Before joining the Corps, he was an Infantryman in the British Army, which included a tour of duty in Iraq at the age of 20. During his 2008-2009 deployment to Afghanistan with Zulu Company, 45 Commando, Steel witnessed firsthand the bravery and sacrifice of his comrades as they faced unimaginable challenges and injuries. These profound experiences, along with the loss of his father to cancer, led Steel to a period of reflection and a major life decision: to follow his passion for magic.

With support from X-Forces Enterprise and Help for Heroes, through their Business Xperience course, Steel was able to turn his dream into a thriving independent career. Now 39, he has been performing as a professional magician for seven years, captivating audiences at weddings, charity events, and Royal Marines functions. He was also a finalist in Britain's Got Talent 2020.

The Queen's Gurkha Signals

For the first time in Soldiering On Awards history, we are honoured to welcome soldiers from The Queen's Gurkha Signals (QGS) to perform the 'Khukuri Dance'. The QGS is a regular unit of the Royal Corps of Signals, one of the combat support arms of the British Army. The Nepalese dance is a blend of martial arts and a demonstration of fighting skills, combining patterns of drill where the dancers demonstrate their skills of handling the Khukuri knife. It is believed the dance was derived from the occasion of celebration when a soldier returned from war with the glory of victory.

Introducing the Soldiering On Academy

With the launch of the brand-new Soldiering On Academy there will be renewed, bespoke provision for Wounded, Injured, and Sick veterans and their families who wish to rejoin the workforce.

Between 2015 and 2020, 282 Wounded, Injured, and Sick (WIS) veterans, service leavers, and their families were supported through a unique enterprise programme called Business Xperience, pioneered by X-Forces Enterprise (XFE). Affectionally classed as the platinum programme due to input on the materials from Help for Heroes, the training provided some attendees with the foundations needed for 'lift off' on their aspirations. For others, it represented a vital lifeline at an extremely challenging time and built confidence, brick by brick, that enabled them to begin their journey to professional independence at a pace that worked for them. The profound efficacy of the course was felt both in career development terms and in the positive impact on well-being.

The Soldiering On Academy, delivered by XFE, will revive enterprise training for those economically inactive members of the Armed Forces community seeking to enter the workforce. Often, physical or mental health challenges can seem like a barrier to moving forwards in life and finding purpose. This programme will allow veterans and their families, who have given so much to their country, to have a fulfilling life after service. By focusing on lifelong enterprise skills, participants will be able to bridge the gap from economic inactivity to flexible futures.

The bespoke course content is designed to build confidence and foster an understanding of different sectors. Using the construct of a business, students will learn foundational



skills and gain an understanding of how businesses work. This knowledge – coupled with XFE's ongoing support and mentoring - can be harnessed to improve the trajectory of their career pathways, whether they choose to go into employment, a portfolio career, or self-employment.

The importance of XFE's structured support for WIS veterans is underlined by a previous beneficiary, Russ Kirby, who built a new career in mounting and framing:

"After the course, I am in a much better place. It helped me to gain confidence in myself, and listening to the other attendees' diverse journeys put things into perspective for me. The best part of running my own business is the independence. Working when it suits me and not being answerable to anyone."

Prof. Gary Packham, Pro Vice Chancellor Student Enterprise and Entrepreneurship at Anglia Ruskin University, commented:

"Enterprise skills are empowering, fuel creativity, and can help realise ambitions. For the Wounded, Injured, and Sick cohort, these skills – delivered through the Soldiering On Academy – could be transformative, and pave the way back into the workforce. With the track record of X-Forces Enterprise in this arena, beneficiaries will be guaranteed not only high calibre training but a holistic approach that is tailored to their needs."

Success Stories



Nigel Seaman founder of Combat 2 Coffee

Nigel was diagnosed with PTSD in 2016, which was linked to his Armed Forces service. It was during his recovery treatment that Nigel came up with his business idea to support Armed Forces veterans who may be struggling with life outside of service through a mobile coffee shop and barista training courses.

"I'm one of the 282 Wounded Injured and Sick that went through the Business Xperience programme with Help For Heroes. Three life events in three months caused me to have a breakdown relating to something that happened in Northern Ireland early in my service career.

If it wasn't for this programme, I probably wouldn't be here now. The belief that was put into me by X-Forces to take something forward has probably saved my life, but also saved many others as well."

John Geden

beekeeper and founder of Sinah Common Honey

John Geden served in the Corps of Royal Military
Police before becoming Detective Chief Inspector for
Hampshire Police. John took early retirement having
been diagnosed with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder.
For therapy and focus, John channelled his energy into
beekeeping and producing honey.

"I needed a focus for my energies; I told myself that sitting in an armchair and feeling sorry for myself was not going to be an award-winning recipe for the future. However at the same time I had to be realistic and I needed to identify what I could do and what I couldn't do.

"The one key piece of support that I simply could not have done without was that given to me by XFE and Help For Heroes. Whenever I suffered a crisis of confidence there was someone with a sensible answer at the end of the phone. My military career taught me the benefits and necessity of team working, but as a sole trader you have to look wider to find that team."

The judging panel selected a shortlist of three entries to progress to the final public vote.





Hero Paws

Started originally by a small group of military dog handlers who had served shoulder to shoulder with their canine comrades, the Hero Paws team recognised that many loyal service dogs needed special care when transitioning into retirement. They saw the need for resources, expertise, and support to ensure these dogs could enjoy peaceful, relaxing retirements after their service. Hero Paws currently supports 70 dogs and families, with many more rehabilitated, rehomed, and living long, happy retirements, alongside medical and financial support.



James 'Jimmy' Hill, Pawseidon

Following medical discharge from the Specialist Military Unit Royal Marines Commandos after 14 years exemplary service, and the loss of his Military Working Dog, Zero, James 'Jimmy' Hill channelled his passion for dogs in a new, inspiring direction. He established the Pawseidon Canine Rehabilitation Centre in Poole, Dorset, a sanctuary dedicated to promoting canine wellbeing and alleviating suffering.



Jane Hoare, Service Dogs UK

As foster liaison at the charity Service Dogs UK, Jane Hoare is instrumental in the assessment of dogs from the Dogs Trust, getting to know the dogs and the veterans, making sure that they are compatible with each other. She has fostered several dogs for the charity herself and provides ongoing support to the veterans in what can only be described as an 'open all hours' service.

On recovery, and determined to change perceptions of what is possible for people with a disability, Hari took on numerous endurance challenges, including kayaking, paragliding, skiing and climbing, achieving the pinnacle of his goals and became the first double above-knee amputee to summit Mount Everest.



Andy Reid MBE

Andy Reid MBE is a triple-amputee and former Corporal in 3rd Battalion The Yorkshire Regiment, who was seriously injured when he stepped on a Taliban IED in Helmand in 2009. Despite life-changing physical and emotional challenges, he finds inspiration in serving others; pushing himself to admirable limits in physical challenges, and raising thousands of pounds for Army Benevolent Fund.



Jonathan Thomson CBE QGM

Jonathan Thomson is a 79-year-old retired Royal Marines Brigadier who has personally organised, planned, and led expeditions to help military personnel suffering injuries to body and mind by guiding them onto a path of self-recovery, while supporting charities such as 65 Degrees North and PTSD Resolution. To date, his endeavours have raised over £100k and have allowed PTSD Resolution to provide free therapy to over 150 veterans, reservists, and family members.






Daniel Sylvester and Dion Sutherns, AlphaOne Electrics Ltd

A Tribute to Wing Commander Tal Lambert-Moore MBE

Anyone who met Tal, would have been extremely saddened to hear he lost his short battle with pancreatic cancer on 28th December 2023. He leaves behind two older children from his first marriage; Chris and Katherine, and his wife Hannah and baby George who was born earlier this year.

Tal and Hannah were planning a wonderful life together and the uplifting news of new life entering the household was warmly welcomed but unfortunately short lived. Tal was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer just eight weeks after they knew Hannah was pregnant.

Tal served his country admirably as a Wing Commander in the RAF and was instrumental in the establishment of the Soldiering on Through Life Trust in 2011, which was the organisation that originally delivered the Soldiering on Awards.

Frustrated by a lack of awareness, recognition and support for UK armed forces personnel, Tal led the charge with a band of like-minded volunteers; John Novelli, Julie Colder and Paul Wooding, to name but a few, to set up and run a Gala Dinner and Awards Night that would recognise great endeavours and celebrate individuals who had put their lives on the line throughout various conflicts.
